



Main Campus Site Development Updates



The City College of Cagayan de Oro is advancing the development of its main campus, reinforcing its mission to deliver accessible, high-quality education. The designated site, located in Sitio Mangalay, Barangay Dansolihon, was officially approved through City Ordinance No. 14986-2024. Originally acquired for resettlement, the property was repurposed for educational use following a letter of non-objection issued by CHUDD in December 2024.

Phase I of the project includes the construction of an administration building, academic lecture building with 24 rooms, student and faculty dormitories, a track and field oval, and essential utilities. The institution is currently securing an Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) from the DENR to ensure sustainable development.

A Technical Working Group composed of various city departments was also formed in February 2025 to oversee the planning and implementation process. A groundbreaking ceremony is set to take place within the year, with Phase I projected for completion in 12 months. The full development will unfold over the next 3–5 years, aligned with the city's RISE Agenda.



DICT Region X Launches Free Wi-Fi For All at CCCDO

The Department of Information and Communications Technology - Region X and the City College of Cagayan de Oro have strengthened their partnership through the launch of the DICT Free Wi-Fi for All on March 13, 2025 at City College of CDO's Agusan Campus.

With the technological support of the Technology Innovation and Data Management Center (TIDMAC), DICT-X has provided essential infrastructure, including server racks and access points to expand campuswide connectivity.

Through this initiative, seamless and reliable internet access is provided, creating a more digitally connected and accessible learning environment for students, faculty, and staff.





Data to Policy Development Course Empowers LGUs and Professionals to Drive Evidence-Based Governance

From March 24 to 28, 2025, professionals and representatives from various local government units (LGUs) successfully completed the inaugural Certification in Data to Policy Development program, organized by the Office for Lifelong Learning and Professional Development and held at the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) Region X Training Center. This intensive five-day training equipped participants with essential competencies in data management, analysis, visualization, and policy formulation—enabling them to transform raw data into actionable insights that support evidence-based policymaking.

Babia, Prof. Kennet Cuarteros, Dr. Joel Potane, Dr. Ray Butch Mahinay, and Dr. Mark Angelo Walag. Series

Ahead of the upcoming Midterm Elections, the Office of Student Affairs and Services (OSAS) conducted the #BallotReady Series, a multi-episode initiative aimed at promoting informed, responsible, and empowered participation among first-time student voters of City College of Cagayan de Oro and the nearby communities.



The first episode of the series was about Voters Education and Automated Counting Machine (ACM) Demonstration, commenced on March 7, 2025 at the City College of Cagayan de Oro Covered Court. Through a collaboration with the Commission on Elections Regional Office, this episode discussed the basics of voter's registration, election processes, and the importance of safeguarding democratic rights. Ms. Gina Luna Zayas-Sabio, Regional Election Attorney, provided insights into how every vote contributes to shaping the nation's future.

The episode also tackled common misconceptions about voting and offered practical guidance on how students can verify their registration status and understand the electoral process. On top of this was the demonstration on the Automated Counting Machine, which was also participated in by elder community members who were invited alongside the students to the gathering. The initiative was also in partnership with the National Service Training Program (NSTP) and the Extension and Outreach Office of the school.

President Babia Leads Organizational Development and Culture Seminar for Misamis Oriental Division Heads

President Jestoni P. Babia of CCCDO led a Organizational two-day seminar on Development and Culture, organized by the Division of Misamis Oriental under Dr. Edilberto L. Oplenaria. Held at C Resort, Libertad, the seminar aimed to strengthen leadership and management skills of 193 division heads modules organizational through on leadership, systems thinking, Competing Values Framework.

Dr. Babia Advocates for Comprehensive Sex Education and Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention in Bombo Radyo Interview

In a live Facebook interview on Good Morning Philippines by Bombo Radyo CDO on January 19, 2025, Dr. Babia shared his insights on Comprehensive Sexual Education (CSE) and Senate Bill 1979, also known as the "Prevention of Adolescent Pregnancy" bill.

Dr. Babia underscored the urgent need for an age-appropriate, culturally relevant curriculum that is anchored in valuesbased education. Also, he advocated for integrating academic research to uncover the root causes of adolescent pregnancy and misinformation about reproductive health. Dr. Babia emphasized that Senate Bill 1979 seeks to reduce teenage pregnancy by promoting reproductive health education, addressing stigma, and correcting misinformation. He noted challenges such as age-appropriate content and the need for well-prepared educators. He stressed the importance of culturally sensitive curricula that support moral decision-making.

Dr. Babia praised City College of CDO's UNLIRICE initiatives for tackling adolescent pregnancy through academic research and thanked Bombo Radyo CDO for facilitating the dialogue, urging collaboration among educators, policymakers, and the public for the bill's success.
